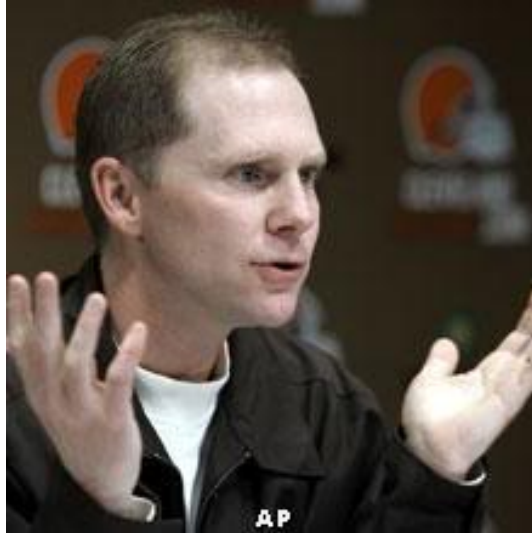


Just Be Right
