Out of Their Hands

Derek Anderson wet the playoff bed.

You can cite DA's relative inexperience, his first time in a 'meaningful' game or whatever excuse you feel better about. But the Browns 19-14 loss in Cincinnati on Sunday comes down to the fact that Anderson was pathetic with a capital S-U-C-K.

Had DA been merely terrible the Browns may have escaped Cincinnati with a win and a playoff spot locked up for the first time since 2002. After all, Carson Palmer and the Bengals seemed more than willing to hand the Browns a win at Paul Brown Stadium. Palmer had as mediocre a day as you can expect from him as he threw for just 115 yards, two interceptions and a TD and he put a goose egg on the board in the 2nd half.

But in just over a minute late in the first half Anderson threw two horrible interceptions that set up the Bengal offense deep in Cleveland territory and led directly to 14 Cincinnati points. Those two picks deep in Cleveland territory went nicely with the other two interceptions that were thrown as the Browns were poised to score and cut into the Bengal lead.

These interceptions were not the garden-variety sort either. They typified everything that is wrong with DA as a QB and everything he needs to work on to improve. Locking onto receivers, throwing late and behind covered receivers over the middle of the field and just generally forcing footballs and displaying a lack of anything remotely close to touch, Anderson put the Browns offense and defense into holes too deep to dig out of.

The biggest shame may be that the defense otherwise throttled a potent Bengal offense and looked poised to help the offense for one of the rare times this season. But at the end of the day the defense was unable to turn touchdowns into field goals as they have so many times this season. Not an unexpected result when on Bengal drive started at the Browns 5 yard line and another at the Browns 20. And we shouldn't overlook the fact yet another opposing running back had a field day running the football. But Kenny Watson's 130 yards didn't kill the Browns like DA did and the Browns defense did turn over the Bengals three times, including an almost critical Watson fumble with less

than two minutes remaining and the Bengals looking to salt the game away deep in Cleveland territory.

Anderson finished 29-48 for 250 yards, two touchdowns and the 4 killer interceptions. Both TD passes went to Braylon Edwards who should be congratulated for breaking the Browns single season TD reception record while being castigated for dropping a couple of catchable balls on a day when his QB was struggling.

Add in a botched snap/hold on a field goal attempt and the Browns simply shot themselves in the foot far too often to expect anything other than what they got.

Exactly what they got was control ripped from them in regard to the playoff race. The loss to the Bengals combined with the Titans 10-6 win over the Jets means the Browns are forced to hope the Colts can take down the Titans next Sunday. Without the Titans falling the Browns are out regardless of what they do next week against San Francisco. And Indianapolis has a history of treating the 16th game like the last pre-season game when they have nothing to gain.

DA picked the worst possible time to throw up all over

himself and play Santa to the Bengals and to the Titans on Sunday.
