To Koscheck's credit, he never stopped coming forward and kept trying to land big shot. He just couldn't get close enough to GSP and after time couldn't see the jabs coming anymore.

The biggest question now is what will GSP do next? Is there a superfight with Anderson Silva on the horizon? Silva needs to take care of Vitor Belfort first which is no easy task. How about Carlos Condit? I'd love to see it as Condit is one of the most exciting fighters in the world. One I do know, GSP looks unbeatable right now and it's scary that he is still getting better.
