

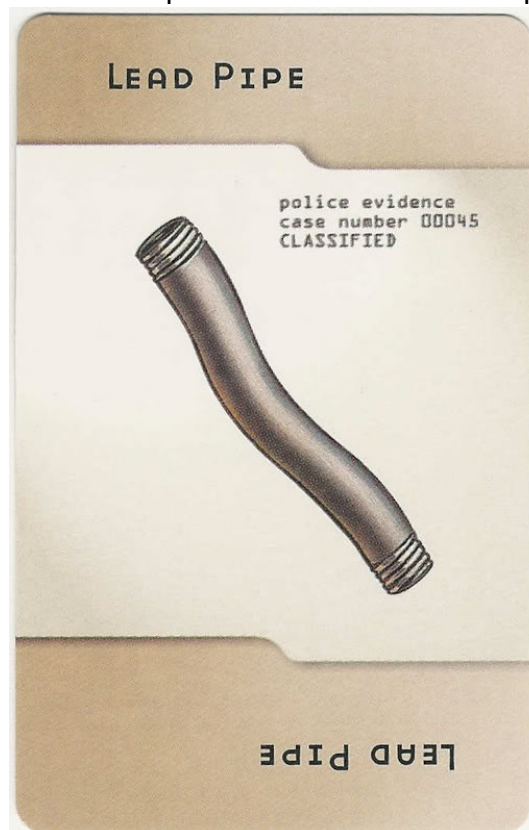
## Lead Pipe Locks
