Also, let's give a big Cleveland welcome to Jason Kapon. As 'B-List' author Steve Buffum would say, "Hey! We had one of those!"

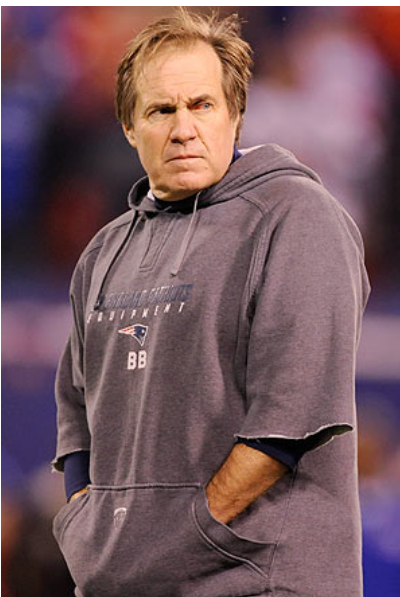
### Sat 11/6 at Washington Bullets...err...Magicians
