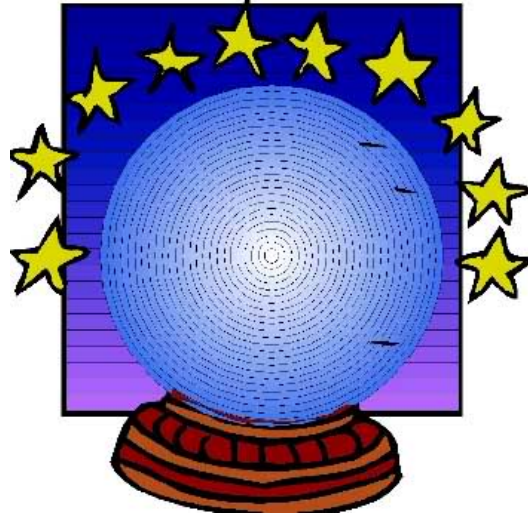


The Crystal Ball - Dec 22 Releases
