News & Rumors:

~ Most of you have probably already seen this, but James Cameron is about to direct his first film in ten years (not counting the fictional "Aquaman" in HBO's "Entourage"). "Avatar" may just end up being as big of a hit in 2009 as Titanic was in 1997. The film will be 40% live action and 60% CGI, utilizing a new technology to film and show in digital 3-D. The story itself is sci-fi, centering on a wounded ex-Marine who is unwillingly sent to settle (and exploit) a distant planet called Pandora. Once there, he is caught up on a battle for survival by the planets native inhabitants, and falls in love with one of them. Supposedly, Cameron has vowed to keep the budget "below \$200,000,000".
