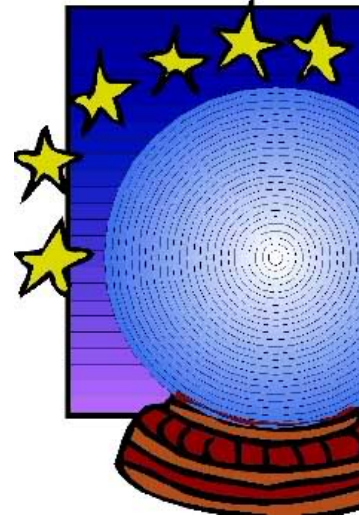


The Crystal Ball - March 2 Releases
