In it, Mitch previews all the new theater releases, DVD releases, Hollywood news and rumors, and future release dates of big projects. This week, there's a bevy of theater releases, headlined by *Perfect Stranger*, starring Halle Berry and Bruce Willis.

Years from now, "Grindhouse" will be the case study to show how a good movie can get screwed over by terrible marketing. The Robert Rodriguez/Quentin Tarantino double bill got trounced at the box office last weekend, despite predictions from all the experts that it would be the #1 movie. So what happened?
