

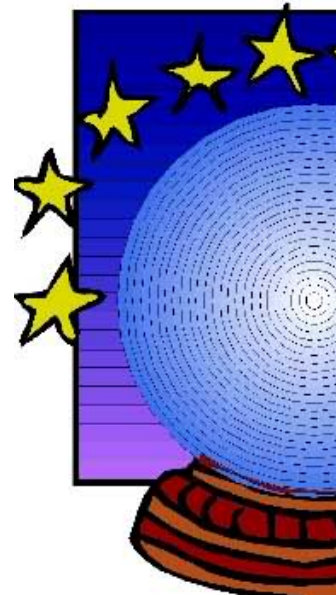
## The Crystal Ball - May 25 Releases
