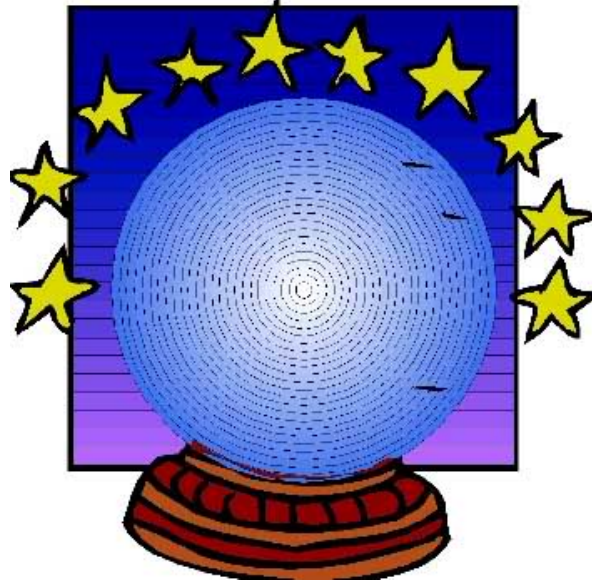


The Crystal Ball - July 6th Releases
