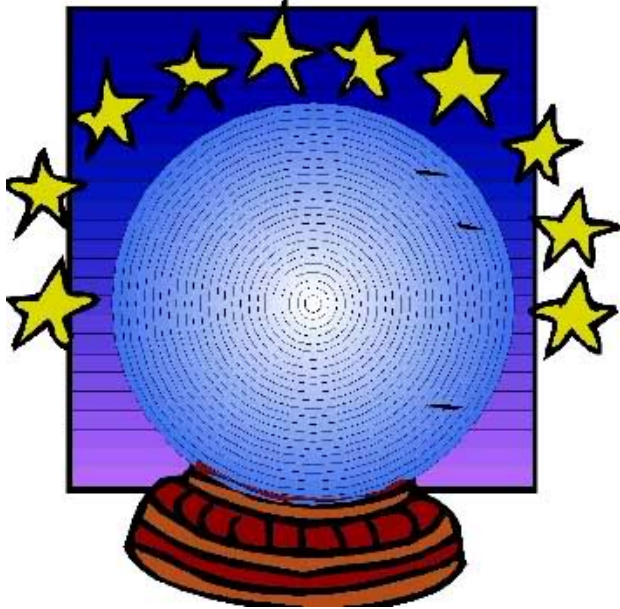


The Crystal Ball - Oct 5 Releases
