

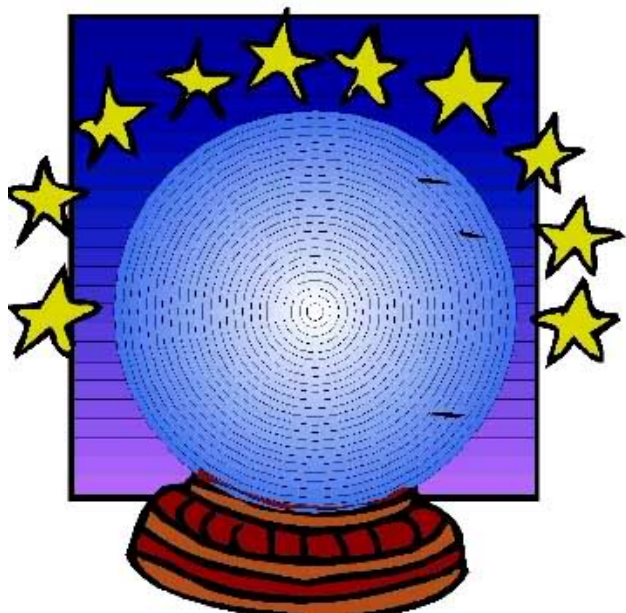
## The Crystal Ball - Nov 16 Releases

"Beowulf" is the big hit release at the theaters this weekend, and in addition to teasing it in this week's Crystal Ball, Mitch is off to the theaters tonight to review the film for the front page of the site.
