

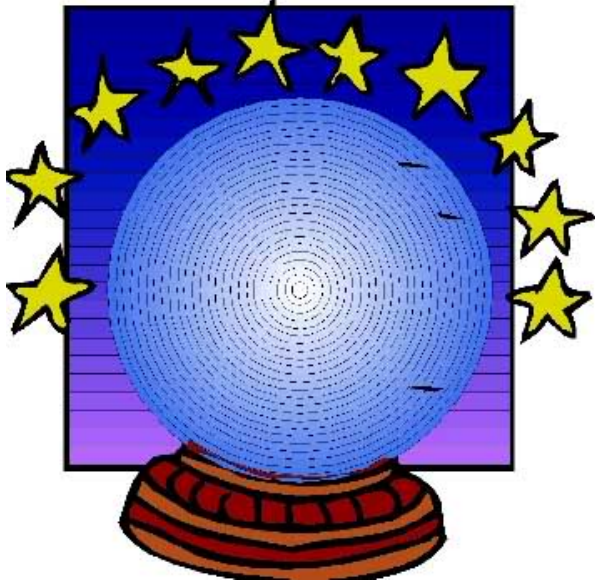
## The Crystal Ball - April 18 Releases

**Charlie Wilson's War** - In my efforts to cover all of the films and roles nominated for the awards season, I sadly did not get a chance to check out this charmingly goofy Tom Hanks, Julia Roberts, and Philip Seymour Hoffman comedy about the renegade Texas Congressman who almost single handedly supplied Afghanistan with enough weapons to successfully drive out the Soviet Union. Top rental of the week.

**Cloverfield** - Sad to say, but this STILL rates as the best 2008 movie I've seen so far. In any case, the hand held camera style of creator J.J. Abrams is
