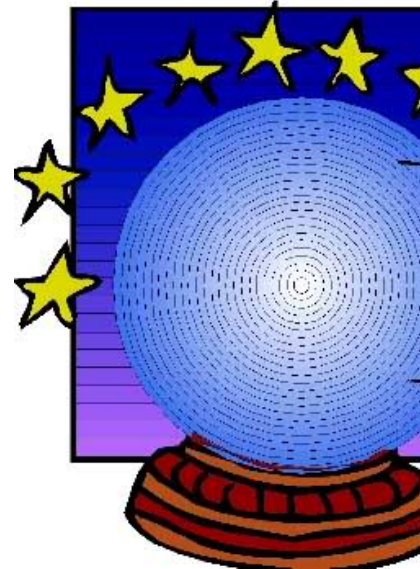


The Crystal Ball - June 20 Releases
