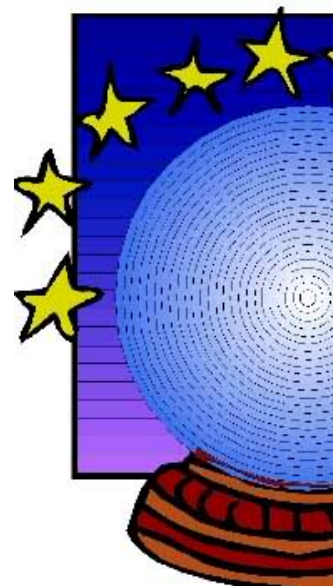


The Crystal Ball - October 3 Releases
