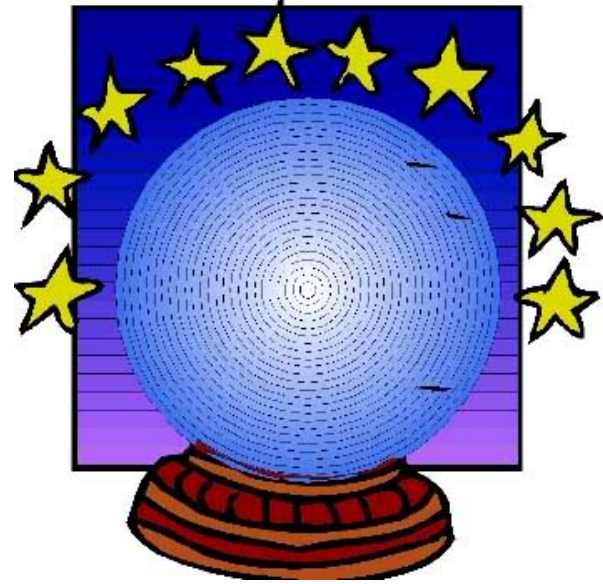


The Crystal Ball - November 7 Releases

"Soul Men", "Madagascar 2", and "Role Models" are this week's three theater releases, and "Get Smart", "Hellboy 2", and "Kung Fu Panda" hit DVD. As he does each Friday night, Mitch gives us the lowdown on all the new movie releases and keeps us posted on all the latest Hollywood gossip, including rumors this week about the sequels to "Iron Man" and "Get Smart", and also the latest projects for Denzel and Charlize Theron.



To start out, let's do a one paragraph review of "RocknRolla". It's not a mainstream film, and it's doubtful that it'll be in the theaters much longer, considering it's low-key marketing...but since I went out and saw it last week, I'll report on it.

Guy Ritchie goes back to his roots, and revisits the Damon Runyon-esque London gangsters and low-lives he previously brought to life in the brilliant "Lock, Stock, and Two Smoking Barrels", and "Snatch". "RocknRolla" isn't as good as either of those movies, but it's not bad, either. Ritchie's characters are a little less over-the-top and more "realistic" in this film, which is good if you like character development, but not nearly as much fun as the last two.

In all, it's a good tale, and Gerard Butler, Tom Wilkinson, and Thandie Newton shine in their roles.

The Hobbit 2 - 2011 - del Toro and Jackson again, this time covering the time between the end of Tolkien's book, "The Hobbit" and the start of LOTR.
