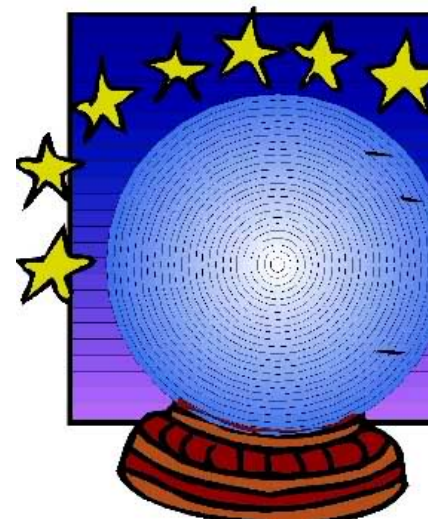


The Crystal Ball - June 23 Releases
