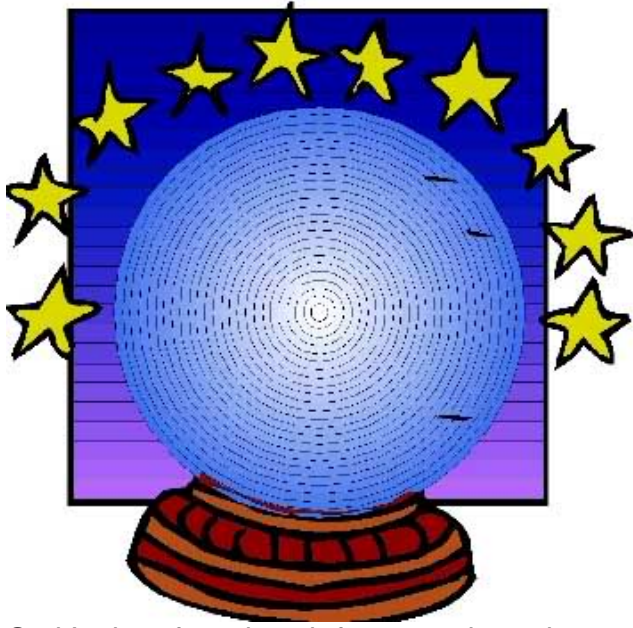

Tim Burton and Johnny Depp are teaming up for the 1,225th time in "Alice in Wonderland", a film that will finally put an end to the dominance of "Avatar" at the box office. Also out this week is "Brooklyn's Finest", another corrupt cop film from the director of "Training Day".
