The football movie "Invincible" (starring Mark Wahlberg) is the weeks biggest release, though big second weekends are expected from "Soap", "Talladega Nights", and "Snakes On A Plane" as well. Mitch recaps the weekend releases to the theaters and on DVD, as well as the latest Hollywood news, rumors, and projects in this weeks edition of 'The Crystal Ball'.



No worries about anyone thinking too much at the theaters last weekend as "Snakes on a Plane" narrowly beat out "Talladega Nights" as the number one movie. But the Future Cult Classic SoaP only raked in \$15 million, which probably will mean it won't even sniff the Top Ten moneymakers of the year...a list in which "Pirates of the Caribbean 2" is all but guaranteed of topping, as this last weekend Captain Jack Sparrow and company became only the seventh film in history to go over \$400 million in U.S. ticket sales.
